HOUSE BILL ***107-FN***

AN ACT relative to employment restrictions for registered sex offenders.

SPONSORS: Rep. Verville, Rock. 2; Rep. Roy, Rock. 31; Rep. Alexander Jr., Hills. 29

COMMITTEE: Criminal Justice and Public Safety

ANALYSIS

This bill prohibits a person convicted of certain sexual assault offenses from hiring or otherwise engaging in any employment or volunteer service which provides direct services to a minor, or supervision or oversight of a minor.

AN ACT relative to employment restrictions for registered sex offenders.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Sexual Assault and Related Offenses; Prohibition From Contact With a Minor. Amend RSA
2 632-A:10 to read as follows:

3 632-A:10 Prohibition From [~~Child Care Service of Persons Convicted of Certain Offenses~~]
4 ***Employment in Businesses Providing Direct Services to Minors or Direct Supervision or***
5 ***Oversight of Minors.***

6 I. A person is guilty of a class A felony if, having been convicted in this or any other
7 jurisdiction of any felonious offense involving child sexual abuse images, or of a felonious physical
8 assault on a minor, or of any sexual assault, he or she knowingly [~~undertakes~~] ***engages in any***
9 ***employment or volunteer service [involving the care, instruction or guidance of minor children,***
10 ***including, but not limited to, service as a teacher, a coach, or worker of any type in child athletics, a***
11 ***day care worker, a boy or girl scout master or leader or worker, a summer camp counselor or worker***
12 ***of any type, a guidance counselor, or a school administrator of any type]* ***that provides direct***
13 ***services to minors, or supervision or oversight of minors.*****

14 II.(a) A person is guilty of a class B felony if, having been convicted in this or any other
15 jurisdiction of any of the offenses specified in paragraph I of this section, he ***or she*** knowingly fails to
16 provide information of such conviction when applying or volunteering for [~~service or~~] ***any***
17 ***employment [of any type involving the care, instruction, or guidance of minor children, including, but***
18 ***not limited to, the types of services set forth in paragraph I]* ***or volunteer activity that provides***
19 ***direct services to minors, or supervision or oversight of minors.*****

20 (b) ***A public or private employer or organization, whose primary intent is to***
21 ***provide direct services to minors, or whose employees provide supervision or oversight of***
22 ***minors, shall conduct a criminal background check of any prospective employee or***
23 ***volunteer.***

24 III. A person is guilty of a class B felony if, having been convicted in this or any other
25 jurisdiction of any of the offenses specified in paragraph I of this section, he ***or she*** knowingly fails to
26 provide information of such conviction when making application for initial teacher certification in
27 this state.

28 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2024.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill prohibits a person convicted of certain sexual assault offenses from hiring or otherwise engaging in any employment or volunteer service which provides direct services to a minor, or supervision or oversight of a minor. This bill contains penalties that may have an impact on the New Hampshire judicial and correctional systems. There is no method to determine how many charges would be brought as a result of the changes contained in this bill to determine the fiscal impact on expenditures. However, the entities impacted have provided the potential costs associated with these penalties below.

It should be noted that a person needs to be found indigent and have the potential of being incarcerated to be eligible for indigent defense services. Historically, approximately 85% of the indigent defense caseload has been handled by the public defender program, with the remaining cases going to contract attorneys (14%) or assigned counsel (1%). Beginning in March of 2021, the public defender program has had to close intake of new cases due to excessive caseloads. Due to these closures, the contract and assigned counsel program have had to absorb significantly more cases. The system is experiencing significant delays in appointing counsel and the costs of representation have increased due to travel time and multiple appointments.

The Department notes any increase in the incarcerated population will have a direct impact on overtime costs given the Department's history of challenges associated with recruitment. In addition, the NH State Prison for Men has a degrading infrastructure which will only be exacerbated if an increase in the incarcerated population were to occur.

Many offenses are prosecuted by local and county prosecutors. When the Department of Justice has investigative and prosecutorial responsibility or is involved in an appeal, the Department may be able to absorb the cost within its existing budget. However, if the Department needs to prosecute significantly more cases or handle more appeals, then costs will increase by an indeterminable amount.

The Department of Safety, Division of State Police indicates this bill would increase state and local expenditures by an indeterminable amount. The Division assumes local government police departments would be impacted with more criminal work related to having to track where offenders may be working with minors. The Division also assumes the bill would create

additional work within the Sex Offender Registry talking calls and notifying local jurisdictions on specifics related to where offenders work and provide services for minors.
